### **Chairperson's Report** – Jennifer Foley

### **Celebrations**

- 1. Few in number but AMAZING Board Members
- 2. **AMAZING People** There are some amazing people out at Camp Lemieux doing amazing things with and for our campers a few amazing counsellors/CITs and a fairly capable summer director this season. That is a very solid base that we need to continue building on.
- 3. **Our Beloved Priests** We had <u>five</u> priests (Fr. John, Fr. Rheal, Fr. Anthony, Fr. Amedee, Fr. Clement) who actively served out at camp this season. Ever grateful!
- 4. Continued Board Communication Biweekly Board Conference Call Meetings were held from May into July preparing for camper season, along with an in person meeting in April. Email & Flocknote are often used for communication between Conference Calls.
- 5. **Archdiocesan Camps Meetings** We attended both Archdiocesan Camp meetings in Regina held pre & post season. Although we all have our own challenges as camps, we have much to learn from each other. Camp Lemieux continues to be acknowledged and celebrated as taking the lead in Catholic camp programming within the Archdiocese of Regina.
- 6. Christ the Redeemer Youth Minister Collaboration Alexis Abello was instrumental in ministering to both our campers and counsellors this season with both success and at great personal expense. God knew we needed her out there this season! We look forward to continuing conversations for implementing something similar next season should it be a possibility.
- 7. **QUALITY of Volunteers & Annual Fish Fry Support** amazing volunteers & overwhelming Fish Fry support. We had our first ever sponsorship request thank you again to Investors Group for sponsoring 2 campers!
- 8. Amazing Swift Current Deanery Support We continue to receive support from our Deanery partners who dedicated their June meeting in its entirety to discussing Camp Lemieux & how they can support. This feedback has been helpful in our visioning & strategic planning grateful for the support and ever welcoming hospitality!
- 9. **Spring Clean Up** Increased Spring Cleanup Attendance = ~20 however we were unable to put the docks in that day. Bob Stringer & crew along with the Swift Current KofC made arrangements to put them in together ©
- 10. Cook Returns Lisa Neudorf, our unbelievable cook, returning for the fourth year. She makes her kitchen the heart and hub of the community during camp season and took on a ministering presence during a tougher than most season.
- 11. Full Slate of Counsellors Hired along with a Summer Camp Director
- 12. Rental Requests We had a 3 day Family Reunion Rental in August this 2017 season and have approved four more rental requests over the next two years: a Moose Jaw Girl Guides June rental, a possible Newcomers Welcome Center July rental and an August long weekend Family Reunion rental for the 2018 season. We will have the privilege of renting for a week long Lions International Summer Camp in our 2019 season.
- 13. Visioning & Strategic Planning Day our Board gathered in Feb 2018 for a visioning & strategic planning day as we contemplate how to address current needs and where we are going next. Michelle Braden Archdiocese of Regina Youth Ministry Coordinator facilitated our day. All KofC Councils, Deanery parishes, priests, potential new Board Members, and all Deanery contacts were invited to join us for the day.

- 14. **Grant Applications Submitted** Grant applications have been submitted for the KofC Charitable Foundation Grant and the Community Initiatives Funding (CIF) Summer Programs Grant with plans for also applying for the Archdiocese of Regina Special Project Grant.
- 15. **Relationship Repaired with Neighbor Grant Klaiber** Grant did major landscaping work widening where possible, pushing back the bush and taking out the blind corners of our driveway. He has a desire to trade services for storage on our lease land around his cabin. He has provided all of these services for free at this time.
- 16. **Honest and Authentic Conversations** Genuinely asking for feedback from many perspectives. Honest and authentic conversations about how to move forward as we become more aware of the current culture and big picture dynamics at play.

### **Challenges**

- 1. QUANTITY of Volunteer Support
- 2. Financial & Volunteer Support from Alumni
- 3. **Incorporation Required** We need to establish corporate identity by becoming a non-profit corporation.
- 4. **Current Discussion around large financial costs** of kitchen upgrades (new ovens), vinyl covered mattresses originally purchased in 2005-06 need to be replaced at ~\$100 a piece (10/year should be replaced)...currently have 112 mattresses needing to be replaced long term.
- 5. **Public Relations/Communication** repairing and rebuilding relationships with parishes, Knights of Columbus Councils, Alumni, etc.
- 6. Counsellor Culture there are underlying tones of mistrust, disrespect, lack of discipline & entitlement that have shown themselves to be the foundation of our counselor culture at this time. We felt the need to make a REALLY hard Board Decision to send 2 counselors home a couple weeks into the season for not living up to the expectations of our programming and our desired culture at Camp Lemieux. This underlying culture was initially addressed early this season and again at the close of the season with all Senior campers, CIT's & Counselors but it will take intentionality and diligence in our hiring practices and interactions to influence this culture in a positive way while modeling our faith well lived.
- 7. **Summer Director Position** The weakness is not with the person, per se, but with the system we've set up. The age of whom we traditionally attracted have been young not much older than the counsellors. He/She has been with them as a counsellor at camp for years...they are friends, brothers, sisters, etc. It's a true challenge for them to be a genuine authority figure in the counsellor's eyes or be able to discipline family and friends at that age. They're doing the best they can but in many ways we've set them up to fail in this role with lack of support. We have increased this level of support the last two years which has revealed a truer culture of our space and the need for more support in both formation and leadership.
- 8. **Sponsorship Need** the need for sponsorship continues to increase and compares to other camps across the Archdiocese (~30% need).
- 9. **Cook Burn Out** Due to the high ministry needs of our counseling team, our cook was quite close to burn out near the end of the season.
- 10. **Caretaking Learning Curve** with finally having someone hired in our Caretaker position after 13 years...we had a learning curve setting lines of communication, policies, practices, salary schedules, etc.

### 2017 Financial Statement – See attached As of Dec 31, 2017

If you look at our Income/Expense statement it looks like we had a net income of \$4982.13....this is not a true reflection as the \$6605.46 was moved over when the Friends of Camp Lemieux Account was closed. This was money rasied in the previous year...so in reality camp ran a \$1623.33 deficit in 2017.

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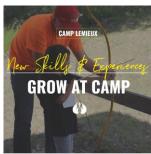

### **Communications Report** – Jennifer Foley

- 1. **2017 Promo Strategy** Early season dates were emailed to all parishes in all 3 Deaneries along with all KofC Councils. All be it much later than I would have preferred (still prefer Feb/Mar as best practice timeline), physical posters & postcards were mailed out to all parishes, Holy Trinity Schools and Medicine Hat Catholic Schools. I now have contact information compiled for all schools in Regina Catholic, Holy Trinity and Medicine Hat Catholic Schools. After an endorsement process, we were granted permission to enter the Medicine Hat Catholic Schools with promo. Regina Catholic is also interested in promoting to the best of their ability outside of classrooms next season. Renee Thibault, our Summer Director, did some presentations in Moose Jaw along the way too.

- 3. **Registration, Team & Volunteer T-shirts** wer ordered with our new logo this season.





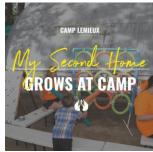

### **Program & Personnel Report** – Jim Dietrich

This past summer the program was headed by Jim Dietrich with on-site help from Alexis Abello & Jennifer Foley. Renee Thibault was hired as our Summer Director, along with a combination of 9 Senior & Junior counselors. Lisa Neudorf returned as our amazing cook for another season. Registration ran smoothly with the help of Jen Dietrich and Val Tienkamp. Although smooth, taking online registrations the way we do is fairly user-friendly for those registering however it is extremely labor intensive on the processing backend. The registration totals were as follows:

2017 Registration Numbers = 116\*

\* 18 of 116 total Registrations required Sponsorship in 2017

- Counsellors-In-Training (a.k.a. CIT's 15-18yrs) = 7
- Youth Campers (9-14yrs) = 73 (29, 24, 20)
- Kidz Campers (Ages 6-8yrs) = 20
- Senior Campers (Ages 12-14 yrs) = 16

### <u>Caretakers Report</u> – Bob Stennick

We were excited to hire Bob Stennick as our Caretaker from mid May to mid Sept this season, originally for 3-4 days/wk which in reality turned into 5-6 days/wk. Thank you to Daniel Erker for his service as Maintenance Committee head as he steps down from the Board at this time. Spring Clean Up was well-attended with 20+ people in attendance and a HUGE thank you to Bob Stringer (& crew) and the Swift Current KofC for putting our docks in this spring. Another HUGE thank you goes to Bob Stennick for picking up the slack for most of our Fall Clean Up this season including pulling in the docks. These are a few of the maintenance tasks completed this season as Bob started to tackle much needed facility maintenance:

Pine Acres: replaced broken window.

Garage: all items were completed on pre-season list

Main Hall:
